RDS Input

We will encourage you to look for gaps in the literature to ensure what you are proposing hasn't been done before and help you to build a clear rationale for the proposed project

We can help you to do this by advising on how to search electronic resources for completed and ongoing reviews, primary studies, guidelines and policies that relate to your idea

We can help you translate your idea into a focused research question and ensure your idea is academically sound and will work within the health and social care system

Even at this initial idea stage we can help you plan and facilitate public involvement activities and identify individuals and groups to work with

It's always a good idea to be discussing your potential research with you R & D Department - even at this early stage - , and we encourage their involvement in with your RDS meetings

We can advise on the most suitable funding schemes for your research idea. Please note we can only support applications that will be submitted to national peer reviewed funding schemes

We can check the proposed study is within the scope of the targeted funding programme, or help to identify an alternative. We can advise on the requirements of funding programmes, including fellowship awards

We can assist you with forming a team with the relevant breadth of expertise, taking into account funding limits or identify gaps in your team and signpost you to potential co-applicants

We can signpost you to other organisations that can provide you with other types of support to help you develop your idea

We can discuss what CRN support you will be given across the research delivery pathway

We can help identify potential organisations and health and social care professionals that could help shape the research idea to ensure it meets the health care needs of the local population

We can provide you support to better understand the local demographics

We have an Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Research Champions Group who can advise on any research involving the local Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic (BAME) population

We have a Young Persons Advisory Group who can advise on any research involving young people

We offer advice on all aspects of research design from helping to formulate the research question(s), support with choosing the appropriate methodology, ensuring the research is informed by public and service user involvement, through to your dissemination plans. We will support you throughout the entire process and will provide feedback at each stage

We can, for example, help you to consider where the project sits in the development pathway - is it going to be a feasibility study, or is it a pilot study followed by a full-scale study?

We can provide guidance on research methods such as sampling, recruitment, outcome measures and quantitative and qualitative health and social science methods. We can meet with you individually or attend and offer advice at research team meetings

Funding panels look at how applicants have involved members of the public in developing their proposal and how patients and service users will be involved in the study. This is an important aspect of research design and the RDS can help potential researchers to achieve this. We have a team of Public Involvement experts and have dedicated funds available in the form of a grant to help you to support your public involvement activities

We can arrange a review of applications by a panel of patients, carers and service users

We can offer advice on how to write a good application and review drafts and provide detailed feedback

We can review drafts and inform you about other peer-review opportunities

We can help you plan how you will disseminate your research findings to different audiences

Should your project receive funding, we are available post-award to direct you to further resources that will help you throughout your research study

If your study does not go exactly to plan, we will be there to help tweak the design of your study to

We can advise on the Health Research Authority (HRA) process for health and/or social care regulatory approvals
